



### **Regarding ARCHIVES B2**

One year ago today, January 24, 2008, my sister, Jane Stubbs Bailey died after a very tough battle with an aggressive form of ovarian cancer. Until she could no longer function to do so, she continued her intensive and extensive research on our Stubbs family roots. John, Jane's husband, delivered to me about 30 file boxes of materials containing Jane's 15 year collection. He also transferred to me 250 email exchanges between Jane and her genealogical network. These emails, added to my own 250 from Jane, contain where Jane had arrived in her research and the relationships and communications she experienced in pursuit of that research. I deem both to be important. After considerable editing, our ARCHIVES B2 has evolved that includes Jane's exchanges and conclusions. You are invited to review ARCHIVES B2. It is 38,700 words long on 46 pages. If you are a Stubbs, you are likely to find something of interest in this document.
